



Child care foundational training are those courses that qualify a person for positions in a regulated early childhood care and education program. Each person working in a regulated program must meet the preservice training requirements for the position held.

Early childhood education (birth through age 8) courses for credit identified as meeting the preservice training requirements for positions in a regulated program are in five WI Core Competencies Content Areas: child development; special needs, disabilities, and inclusive practices; learning environments, strategies, and curriculum; health, safety, and nutrition; and guidance and nurturing.

Business courses for credit from an institution of higher education identified as meeting the preservice training requirements for positions in a regulated program such as Administrator, Licensed Family Child Care, and Director are in the areas of administration, supervision, operations management, finance/accounting, and human resources. Business courses for credit must be at least 2 credits and in the WI Core Competencies Content Area: Administration and Management (general (ADM), finance (FIN), personnel (PER)).

Noncredit Courses

Noncredit courses may be taken through private agencies approved by the Department of Children and Families or through the Wisconsin Technical College System. All noncredit courses, regardless of the sponsoring agency, must have one of the below names to meet the requirements of the rule. The noncredit courses which have been approved as meeting the child care foundational training requirements include:

10-hour Administrator

• This course is no longer offered, but if taken prior to January 1, 2009, it may be used to meet the 10 hours of training in supervision or personnel management for administrators or center directors.

10-hour School-age Assistant Child Care Worker

• This course meets the requirements for an assistant teacher in a school-age only program.





40-hour Family Child Care

• This course is no longer offered, but if taken prior to Sept 1, 2003, it may be accepted in lieu of the Introduction to the Child Care Profession course.

Center Administrator

• This course must be 40 hours or more. This course is no longer offered, but if taken prior to January 1, 2009, it may be used as one of the 4 courses required for a center director of a large child care center licensed to care for 51 or more children or as the one course in business required for a center administrator.

Center (Program) Director

• This course must be 40 hours or more. This course is no longer offered, but if taken prior to January 1, 2009, it may be used as one of the 4 courses required for a center director of a large child care center licensed to care for 51 or more children.

Fundamentals of Family Child Care

• This course is required for certified and licensed family child care as of January 1, 2016.

Fundamentals of Infant and Toddler Care

• This course is required for persons working with children under age 2. A degree in Early Childhood or Child Care contains the requirement for the Fundamentals of Infant and Toddler Care.

Introduction to the Child Care Profession

• This course is for any administrators, directors, teachers, assistant teachers, certified/licensed family child care, substitutes or volunteers that are counted in staff-to-child ratios.

Skills and Strategies for the Child Care Teacher

• This is the 2nd course for teachers and directors in a center licensed for 50 or fewer children.
